Call to Order

Alan Krouse called the meeting to order, and it was determined that a quorum was present.

Approve Previous Minutes

A motion was made by Mark Martin, seconded by Mary Stringfellow to approve June 9, 2022, minutes as presented. On vote the motion unanimously passed.

I-10 Widening Pedestrian & Bicycle Presentation

EDSM Subcommittee Updates

EDSM Subcommittee meetings are beginning again and a rough draft is being worked through.

HSIP Updates

The goal is to use 20% of the HSIP funds for Vulnerable road user (VRU); the requirement is 15%. Pedestrian projects are targeted because that is where data suggests the majority of the need is – more data is necessary for bike needs and for pedestrian needs on non-state routes (e.g. sidewalk inventory, ADT, etc.). VRU funding needs to be used on standalone pedestrian/bicycle non-motorized user projects. VRU focus is safety where state crash data shows the fatalities and serious injuries are above a certain threshold that is set nationally. The money needs to be spent on existing safety issues with data driven risk. Guidance on this is currently being written. Unspent HSIP money rolls over – if 15% isn't spent the previous year, the next year 15% plus the remaining amount has to be spent.

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Ped & Bike Research Project Updates

Three main projects going through LTRC related to Complete Streets:

- 1. Pedestrians & Bicyclists Count: Phase 2 Implementing & Applying MultiModal Demand Data
 - a. This project is wrapping up this fall and is basically done.
 - b. Gathering pedestrian and bicycle data
- 2. Researching the implementation of the Complete Streets Policy in projects
- 3. Using human mobility data to support actual active transportation planning work in Louisiana

MoveBR Updates (Airline Hwy/Florida Blvd)

Tabled.

Protected Bike Lane Discussion

Mark had a question about the Bob Petit/Nicholson project and the lack of protected bike lanes on this project. Why not either add a protected bike lane, or combine it with the sidewalk and create a multiuse path? This is a MoveBR Project. There was discussion regarding preferred facility types.

Transportation Alternatives Discussion

More money, more categories – many opportunities. Keep your eyes peeled for changes and rules coming.
