1. Introduction

A public meeting for the LA 143 – US 165 Connector and Ouachita River Bridge Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) project was held at the Monroe Civic Center, Ouachita Room, 401 Lea Joyner Expressway, in Monroe, Louisiana, on Tuesday, March 12, 2013. The meeting was held from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. A public officials preview was held from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the same day.

This document provides copies of the public meeting materials, sign-in sheets, and a summary of the March 12, 2013, public meeting events. Comments received from local officials and stakeholders from the date of the public meeting through the close of the public comment period on March 22, 2013, are provided.

2. Public Meeting Notice

A public meeting notice was published in the NewsStar on March 1 and March 8, 2013, and the Ouachita Citizen on March 7, 2013. The advertisement copy of the meeting notices and affidavits of publication are provided in Appendix A. A meeting flyer and postcard indicating the project name, purpose of the meeting, date, place, and time were sent via email or U.S. mail to key stakeholders, elected officials, and members of the public who requested project correspondence. A reminder e-mail was sent to local officials on March 7, 2013. Copies of the postcard, flyer, reminder e-mail, and contact lists are provided in Appendix B.

The public meeting was also announced on page 6 of the Monroe Chamber of Commerce Weekly Report for March 11, 2013 (Appendix B).

3. Press Release and Media Coverage

The LA 143 – US 165 Connector and Ouachita River Bridge Project was covered by the NewsStar on March 13, 2013. The Monroe news television station, KNOE 8, provided an announcement of the public meeting at the 5:00 p.m. broadcast on March 12, 2013. Copies of the media coverage for the public meeting are provided in Appendix C.

4. Meeting Events

Utilizing a contact list of interested parties developed in coordination with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (LADOTD), elected officials were invited to a meeting at the Monroe Civic Center from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. A letter of



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invitation for the meeting was mailed on March 5, 2013. A sample letter and copy of the mailing list are provided in Appendix D.

The elected officials meeting preceded the public meeting and provided local officials an opportunity to preview the materials and displays related to the EIS process that is underway. A PowerPoint presentation describing the project and explaining the purpose of the meeting was shown.

The public meeting that followed was organized in an open house format. The same PowerPoint presentation that was shown to the elected officials was shown for the public meeting as an automated loop presentation with voiceover. The presentation repeated approximately every 20 minutes and was shown for the duration of the open house. A copy of the PowerPoint presentation with the voiceover script is provided in Appendix E.

The purpose of the public meeting was to present the results of the travel demand and toll study, explain the centerline development and screening process, and identify the three corridors recommended for alternative development and evaluation in the EIS. Traffic and tolling scenarios with and without the Ouachita Loop were reviewed to demonstrate how these data support the purpose and need presented previously at the Public Scoping meeting held on August 14, 2012. General design criteria were also presented. In order to obtain input from the public on the project and recommended alternative corridors, a comment form and map were provided in the handout (Appendix F).

In addition, the public meeting was an opportunity for any interested party to request participation in Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act consultation to address cultural and historical resource issues related to the project. Three organizations expressed interest in the Section 106 consultation process as indicated on the Section 106 sign-up sheet (Appendix G).

5. Attendance

Seventy persons registered their attendance on the sign-in sheets. Of these persons, 12 were public officials, 11 were representatives from LADOTD and the Federal Highway Administration, 8 were members of the project consultant team, and 39 were members of the public. Copies of the sign-in sheets for the officials meeting and public meeting are provided in Appendix H.



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6. Public Comments

The public was offered two opportunities for submitting their comments for the record during the public meeting. A comment form was provided in the meeting handout and a transcriber was available during the course of the meeting to record verbal comments. Written comments by electronic mail received through the close of the comment period, which was established as March 22, 2013, are provided in Appendix I. Comments sent via U.S. mail and postmarked by that date are also included in Appendix I. A transcript and transcript certification of the verbal comments are provided in Appendix J.

Commenters who indicated a preference for Corridor 1 noted that the corridor avoids existing neighborhoods. Additional comments noted that the fourth bridge is needed and will provide better access for emergency services; reduce traffic congestion at peak hours; improve travel to the northern portions of Monroe and West Monroe; relieve congestion on existing bridges and travel routes; and support growth that is already taking place to the north and northwest.

Some comments pertained to natural resources including preservation of the natural environment integral to the Ouachita River. It was suggested that a non-development corridor easement be designated along the river to protect the aesthetic and wildlife resources with the intention of voluntary participation by landowners.

Comments and questions received by the project team during the meeting, but not formally submitted for the written record, are listed below:

1. Why is Terminus AE being considered when Terminus AD is a direct connection to Finks Hideaway?
2. Is there an opportunity for the residences next to Terminus AD to be bought out and moved to better housing?
3. Has a crash/safety study been performed for the eastern termini?
4. Why was the centerline that hugs/parallels the levee eliminated?
5. Have / will ramps / partial cloverleaves / cloverleaves / continuous flow intersections been/be considered?
6. Is there any funding for building this project?



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7. How much money was allocated for this project and how has it been spent?
8. Has or will an economic study be done to assess effects of decreased traffic on existing bridges?
9. Why have the western termini north of the current northernmost terminus been eliminated? It seems as though these would have lesser impacts?
10. What are the costs of the project?
11. Is tolling feasible and how much of the costs will it cover?
12. Will the facility have any exits between the western and eastern termini?
13. Why is the 50-year flood level referenced on the embankment typical section, and is the resulting embankment section sufficient given likely inundation of the section during the 100-year flood?

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MONROE, La. (KNOE 8 News) - A fourth bridge over the Ouachita River isn't a new idea, the discussion has been going on for decades. Tuesday project managers met with the public to get their opinions.

Monroe's Economic Development Officer, Dwight Vines, says "the first study started back in the 60's. Back when I was president of the chamber of commerce in the late 70's we had a study on a specific site."

That study like many others had people opposing the location. With the three bridges currently connecting the twin cities, nearing capacity, the effort has been revived by legislators. They are funding the first step of the project: a two year long study.

Project Manager, Scott Hoffeld, says, "the study area is between LA 143 and US 165, in an undeveloped area in Monroe and West Monroe." Where to build the 4th bridge has been the biggest debate. Leaders believe this time they have a plan they think the majority will agree with.

Vines says, "we'll probably never build a road that there is no opposition to. I think it's far enough out, that it'll have wide spread support." Vines, says this location would be low impact. He says, "this site we are looking at now is out of town, and it cuts across the swamp."

Money is still a concern. Past studies have projected such a project to cost anywhere near 200 million dollars. One option is a toll road. Vines says, "their study indicates that \$1.50 per car would maximize income, total income."

The cost of construction won't be realized until the study has concluded in 2014. Project managers encourage you to give them feed back. It must be posted marked by March 22nd. You can mail your comments to:








Rural East-West Connection





Centerline development methodology included geographic information system (GIS) layer development, field work, Ouachita River and levee crossing considerations; roadway layout; property ownership maps; protected resources; sensitive land use; and other fatal flaws.



Six new LA 143 termini were developed on the west with higher elevations and reduced apparent wetland impacts. Three US 165 termini options were considered on the east.



Segment centerlines were joined together and used to create preliminary corridor centerlines.



Traffic modeling supported the elimination of the Kansas Lane terminus to the southeast. This shows centerlines after elimination of Stage 0 Concepts and the Kansas Lane Terminus.



The results, based on the preliminary criteria evaluated, is series of refined centerlines.



On March 12, 2013, there was a Public Meeting held at the Monroe Civic Center for the referenced project. I had previously mentioned this meeting to the Ouachita Parish Police Jury and the importance for some of them to be in attendance and provide any comments they may have. I believe several individuals representing the Police Jury were in attendance.

I spoke to Walt Caldwell, District C Police Juror, prior to the Public Meeting and a couple of times after the meeting. Mr. Caldwell had this project on the Police Jury agenda for their meeting on March 18, 2013. We discussed the hand-outs from the Public Meeting and the Police Jury authorized me to provide a comment letter to you regarding the different alignment corridors being studied.

The Police Jury is in favor of Corridor No. 1 with a few changes to it. These changes are as follows from the west end to the east end:

1. The terminus on the west end would be at Terminus J along Lakeside Drive and remove Terminus L.
2. When the alignment clears the north side of McGuire Lake No. 2, curve the alignment to the east to cross the Ouachita River east of Chauvin Bayou.
3. Keep the alignment east of Chauvin Bayou and west of the Ouachita River Levee until it reaches a point to cross the Ouachita River Levee north of Belle Pointe Subdivision.
4. Tie the alignment into Terminus AD at U.S. Highway 165 in line with the proposed alignment for Fink's Hide-A-Way Road.


During some of the meetings of the study, the east end had tie-ins in different locations. There were several reasons some of the locations were dropped from further studies. The Police Jury wants the Connector Road to line up with other major routes when practical and feasible.

The alignment on the east end was shifted away from Fink's Hide-A-Way Road due to the Delta Southern Railroad being located close to U.S. Highway 165 and the Connector Road not having enough distance to transition from an elevated roadway back down to grade. Due to the low use of this section of Delta Southern Railroad, the Police Jury recommends using an at-grade crossing for the Connector Road.

Ouachita River Crossing

The Chauvin Bayou river entrance and the “old growth” hardwoods across from it should be avoided for numerous environmental, structural and cost considerations. Furthermore, there is no construction corridor. In contrast, the transmission power line crossing (“south crossing”) provides an existing construction corridor (i.e. the transmission line right-of-way), and merely expands the existing environmental disruption. This is analogous to merely “widening” a road as opposed to building a new interstate through a wildlife/wetlands reserve. The structural integrity and building cost are optimized at this “south crossing.” Finally, all current and suggested modified corridor options can be accommodated by this location with excellent point alignment

Considering:

- Environmental Impact (wetlands, trees, wildlife et al)
- Cost - \$ and environment
- Structural integrity
- Construction disruption *
- All proposed options and finalist modification proposals
- Point alignment

It strongly appears that the Ouachita River crossing should occur at your “south crossing” immediately adjacent to the north side right-of-way of the transmission line (XK1).

With these same considerations, the west side transmission line corridor from the river to the point where the transmission line enters the open field (XK2) best accommodates all corridors under consideration.

Once this **Keystone Corridor** (XK1 to XK2) is established, the east side decision is whether to select the expensive point (EP) or the political point (PP) – above our pay grade 😊!

The west side decision depends on whether the terminal will be north of Lakeside which requires going to the KC point (Kate Circle) or going to the Lakeside Point (LP) located at the inflection of the transmission line which can accommodate all terminal options not north of Lakeside.

Once the EP versus PP and the KC versus LP decisions are made, it simply becomes a matter of the best terminal location and design for each side.

Clarity at last! The points align in a manner *compatible with* the shortest point (SP) concept.

To summarize

- **Step I** - establish the South Crossing Keystone Corridor (XK1 to XK2)
- **Step II** – pick your pivotal points on the East (EP vs PP) and West (KC vs LP)
- **Step III** – select the terminal
- **Step IV** - design the terminals (stop lights vs continuous flow vs hybrid)

Crucial Bridge Points

West side

XK1 – Keystone Corridor 1

The bridge crossing point on the west bank of the river that coincides with the transmission power line crossing

XK2 – Keystone Corridor 2

The west side point where the transmission line enters the open field

LP – Lakeside point

The west side inflection point of the transmission power line. All Lakeside and Lakeside south termini (termini J, K, and L) can pivot off this point with the least environmental impact, construction disruption and expense.

KC – Kate Circle Point

Where corridor one and two merge off the north corner of Kate Circle. This is where the I terminal option will pivot to its highway 143 connection north of Lakeside

WT – West terminal (I, J, K or L)

Eastside

EP – Expensive point

The point where corridor 1 option crosses the eastside levee

PP – Political point

The point where corridor 2 and 3 options and the transmission power line intersect (the thread the needle next to the Monroe Athletic Club point)

ET – East terminal (AD, AE, or AF)





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

OUACHITA RIVER NON-DEVELOPMENT TRUST
(Mitigation proposal to protect river aesthetics and wildlife corridor)

Ouachita Parish (and NE Louisiana) is increasingly being defined by the growth and association with Century link, ULM, healthcare facilities and its outdoor hunting/recreational activities. The proposed fourth bridge has the opportunity to link these industries and our communities in an unprecedented manner. The east-west transit time (depending on limited access/continuous flow terminal design) has the potential to drop to slightly **under five minutes**. This will stimulate growth in the two largest economies (Monroe/West Monroe) in northeast Louisiana in many obvious as well as unforeseen manners. All four of the major industries above can be positively impacted in substantial manners. The first three of these industries will passively grow. However, enhancing the overall outdoor recreational experience may require more activism. The bridge can simultaneously initiate and showcase this enhanced outdoor opportunity in the following manner.

The Ouachita River is one of the most scenic rivers in America but its beauty is gradually being eroded by development. This river also serves as the wildlife sustaining artery for the entire upper Ouachita basin and is the home of apex avian (Bald Eagles/wild turkey) and mammalian (Black Bear/Deer) predators and prey as well as millions of migratory waterfowl. Efforts by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are already underway to connect and expand the 42,594 acre upper Ouachita and 65,000 acre Felsenthal (southern Arkansas) National Wildlife Refuge Complex. After expansion, this combined complex's acreage will approach 150,000 acres. With a combined public and private effort, the D'Arbonne National Wildlife Refuge which has comparable acreage could also be connected. A goal of a quarter of a million acre combined wildlife refuge is not unreasonable. A central core objective of this concept could be to establish a non-development corridor along the Ouachita River extending north from Bayou Desaird on the east side and Tupawek Bayou on the west bank all the way into southern Arkansas.

Using the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service model of securing the most acreage with available resources, the efforts to **protect the aesthetics of the river** including old growth hardwoods , **as well as the wildlife corridor**, could be accomplished with non-development/timber rights easements rather than direct title acquisition. Landowners would retain title and all other rights (recreational/hunting, etc.) and obligations (taxes, etc.). This approach would curtail loss of parish tax revenue and obtain the most rapid landowner support-particularly if it is coupled with enforcement of enhanced trespassing/poaching regulations. Consistent with long standing U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service policy, only willing land owner easement sellers would participate. **No land or easements would be acquired without owner consent**. Areas already developed and land of non-participating landowners may be bypassed if critical to maintaining an uninterrupted wildlife corridor.

Specifically, a proposal for establishing the Ouachita River Non-development Trust consisting of a ¼ - ½ mile wide non-development/timber preservation corridor on both sides of the river could be considered. This could quickly connect D'Arbonne Wildlife Refuge with the combined Upper Ouachita/Felsenthal Wildlife Refuge and secure this critical threatened wildlife corridor. Mitigation funds required by the wetland utilization for the bridge development could secure the entrance of this corridor on either side of the new bridge. The bridge would then become the "gateway" to this massive upper Ouachita River ecosystem whose aesthetics and viability would be preserved in perpetuity and define our region.

12 presently receive from both real estate taxes and sales
13 taxes.

14
15 ANTHONY RISPOLI:

16 I just wanted to say that I think this is a great
17 project. I think it's good for the community of Monroe, West
18 Monroe and Ouachita Parish. I think Corridor #1, which I
19 believe would require less expense on land cost because you
20 would displace less people, and I think that would prevent a
21 lot of inconvenience and save a lot of cost. And I just
22 certainly wish this project the very best and you have my
23 full support. I have twenty acres in the Chauvin area, and
24 even though I might be affected if you use one of those other
25 corridors, rather than go through any expense, I'd just wish

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you would use Corridor #1. It looks the best of all the corridors. With, seems like, less people involved, the easier things will flow. That's all I wanted to say.
