#542801, City of Waverly: Had widespread flooding damage that destroyed hundreds of homes. City hired temporary employee to ensure compliance for new development within floodplains. 226 Force Account Labor Regular Hours For Temporary Employee.

DR-4614 Remnants of Hurricane Ida in New Jersey

#660651, Manville Borough: Manville Borough was significantly impacted and over 700 homes, commercial facilities and structures flooded up to 8 feet deep. Assessment of substantial damage documentation covers 440 homes assessed between 9/8/21 and 1/30/22 by a contractor.

Obligated: \$106,337.48 federal share, \$11,815.27 non-federal share.

#657321, Hillsborough Township: Applicant utilized contract services for structure inspections to Hillsborough TWP private properties and buildings in order to enforce floodplain management ordinances. Assessment of substantial damage documentation covers 48 homes assessed between 10/26/2021 and 1/16/2022.

\$25,920 federal share, \$2,880 non-federal share.

CSRS A LAFOURCHE AUTHORIZED CONTRACTOR

What is Substantial Damage?
If a home is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) and the home is damaged from a natural flooding event, the contractor must determine if the structure is substantially damaged. A building is substantially damaged when the cost of repairs is 50% or more of the structure's pre-damaged value and the structure is damaged. If the total cost to repair is more than \$50,000 and the structure value is \$50,000, the term is a split structure: making it substantially damaged.

How did my property get selected for this inspection?
All properties in Lafourche Parish that are located within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) are being inspected. Home inspections are completed.

How do I determine the current elevation of my house?
The elevation of your house is determined by a contractor or other authorized professional. Insulation Code books, shared with your local floodplain administrator, are the most accurate reference books for your area.

What happens if Lafourche Parish fails to enforce its local floodplain management ordinance?
Failure to enforce floodplain management ordinance can result in the community's continued participation in the risk and ability to qualify for federal assistance in future disaster events.

How can I schedule an inspection?
You can schedule an inspection by contacting the Inspected Lafourche Program at 866-866-1307. They will work with you to schedule an inspection at your earliest convenience.

Will the inspector call me prior to their arrival at my home?
Yes, the inspector will call you to let you know if you scheduled an inspection for that day and if you are able to meet.

What can I expect during the inspection?
