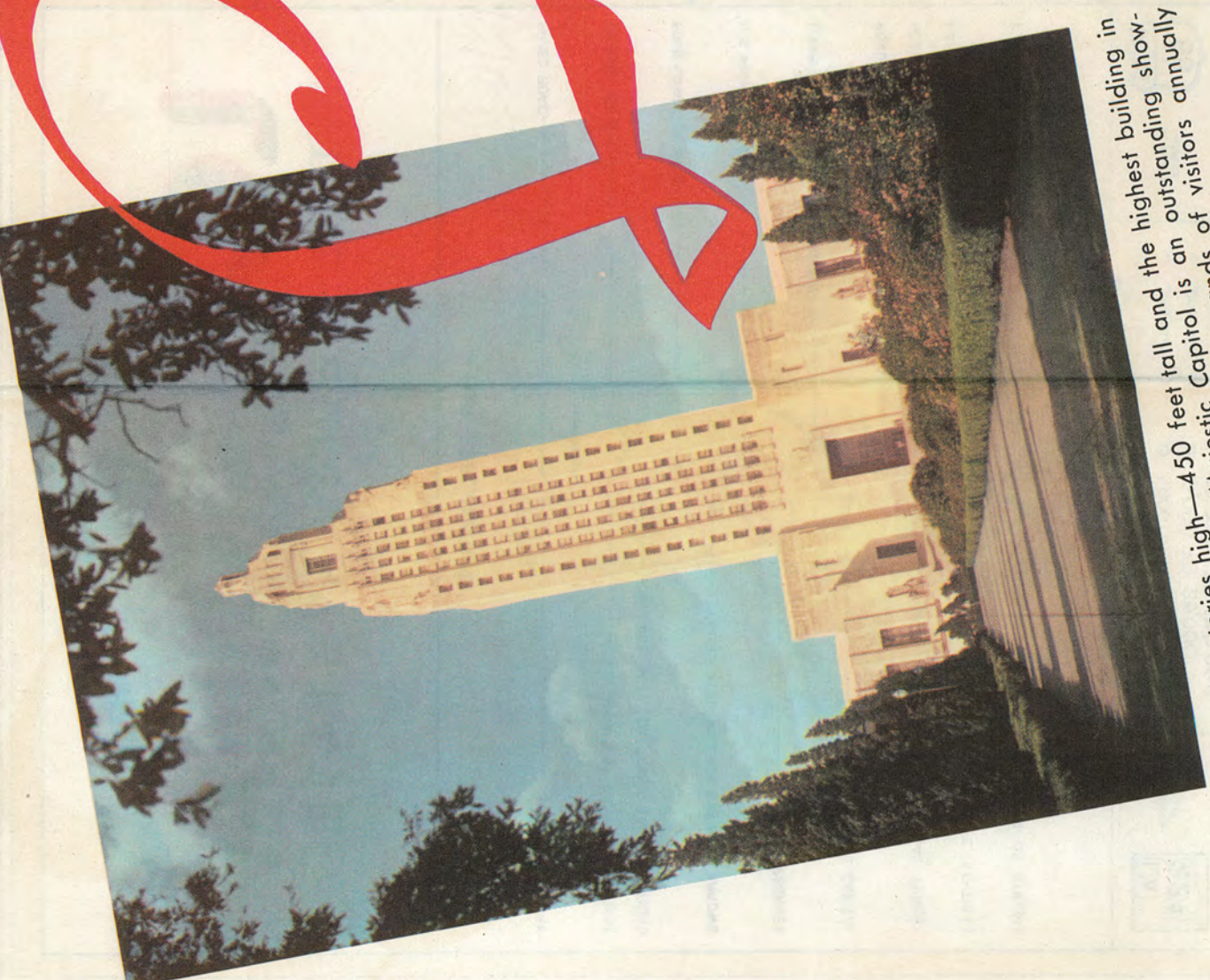
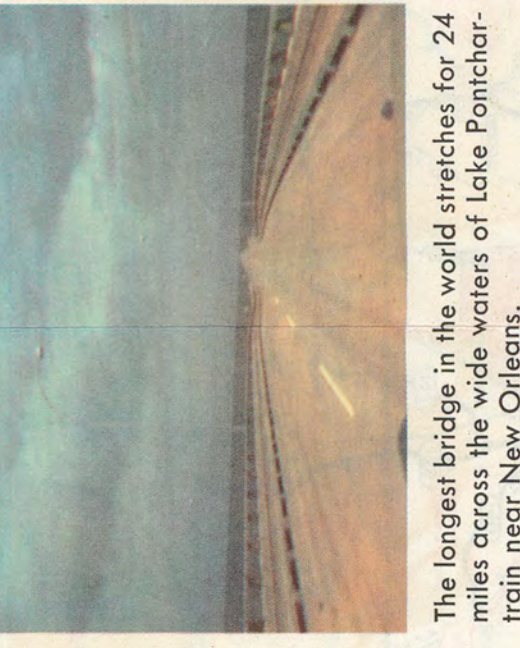

Thirty-four stories high—450 feet tall and the highest building in the South—Louisiana's majestic Capitol is an outstanding showplace from all parts of the Nation.



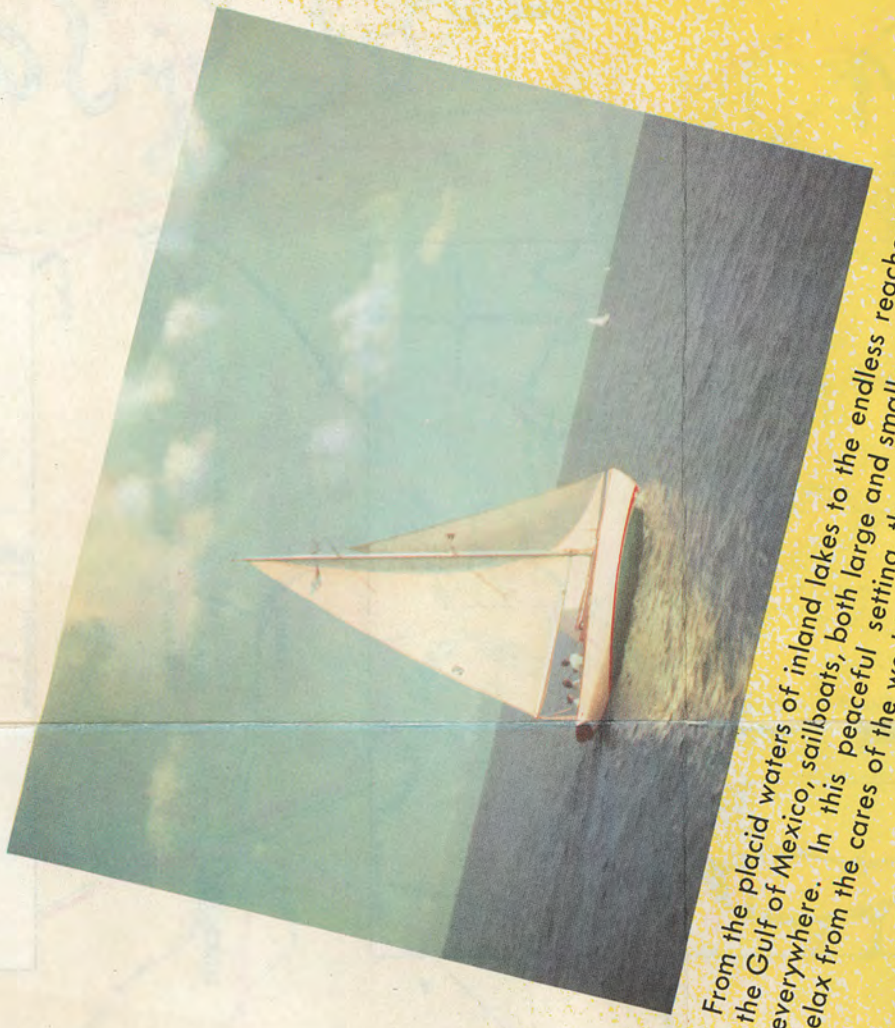
The longest bridge in the world stretches for 24 miles across the wide waters of Lake Pontchartrain near New Orleans.

Driving along the river road and bayou one will see the remnants of a gracious yesteryear— the plantation mansions where once beillum social life.



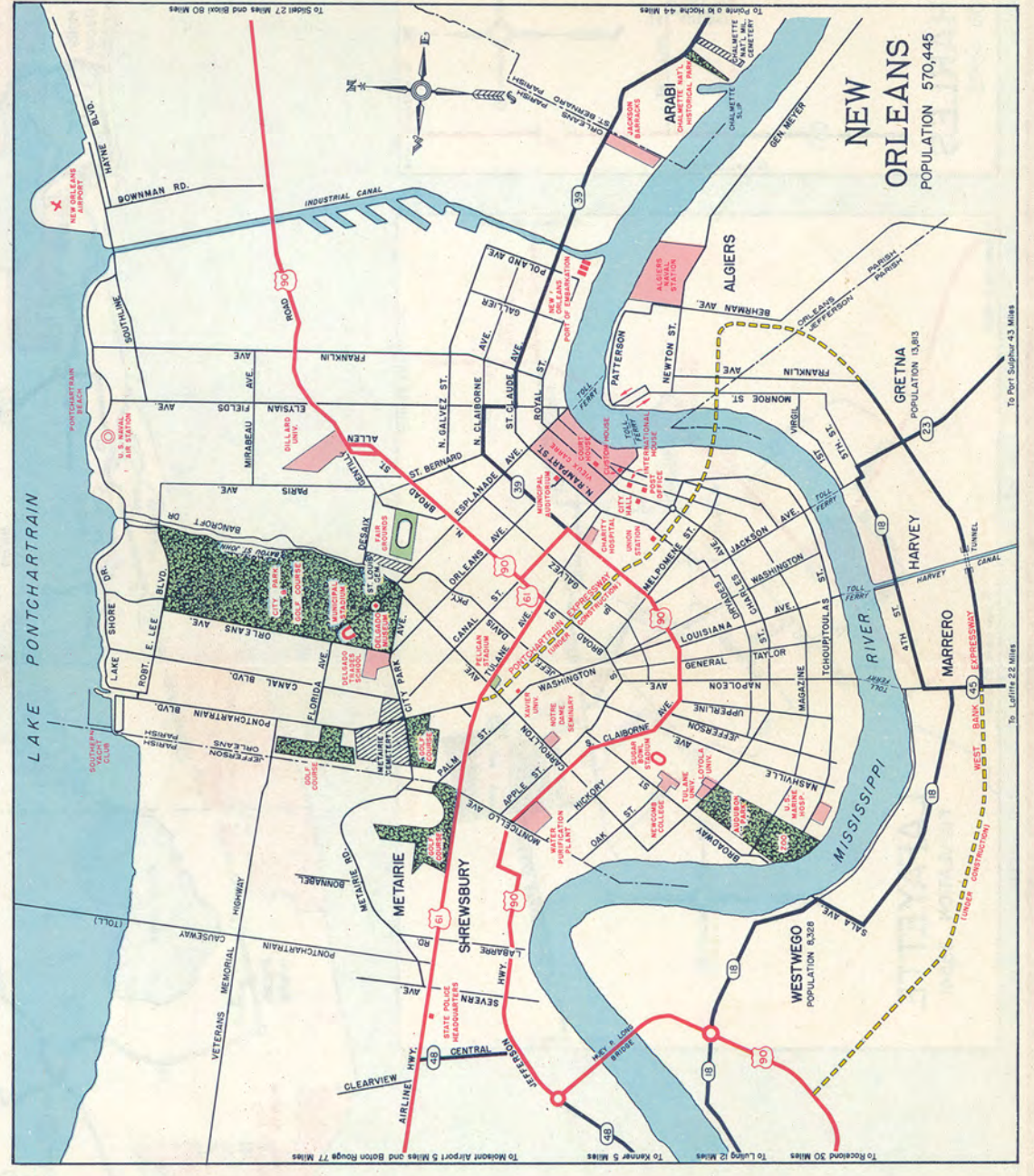
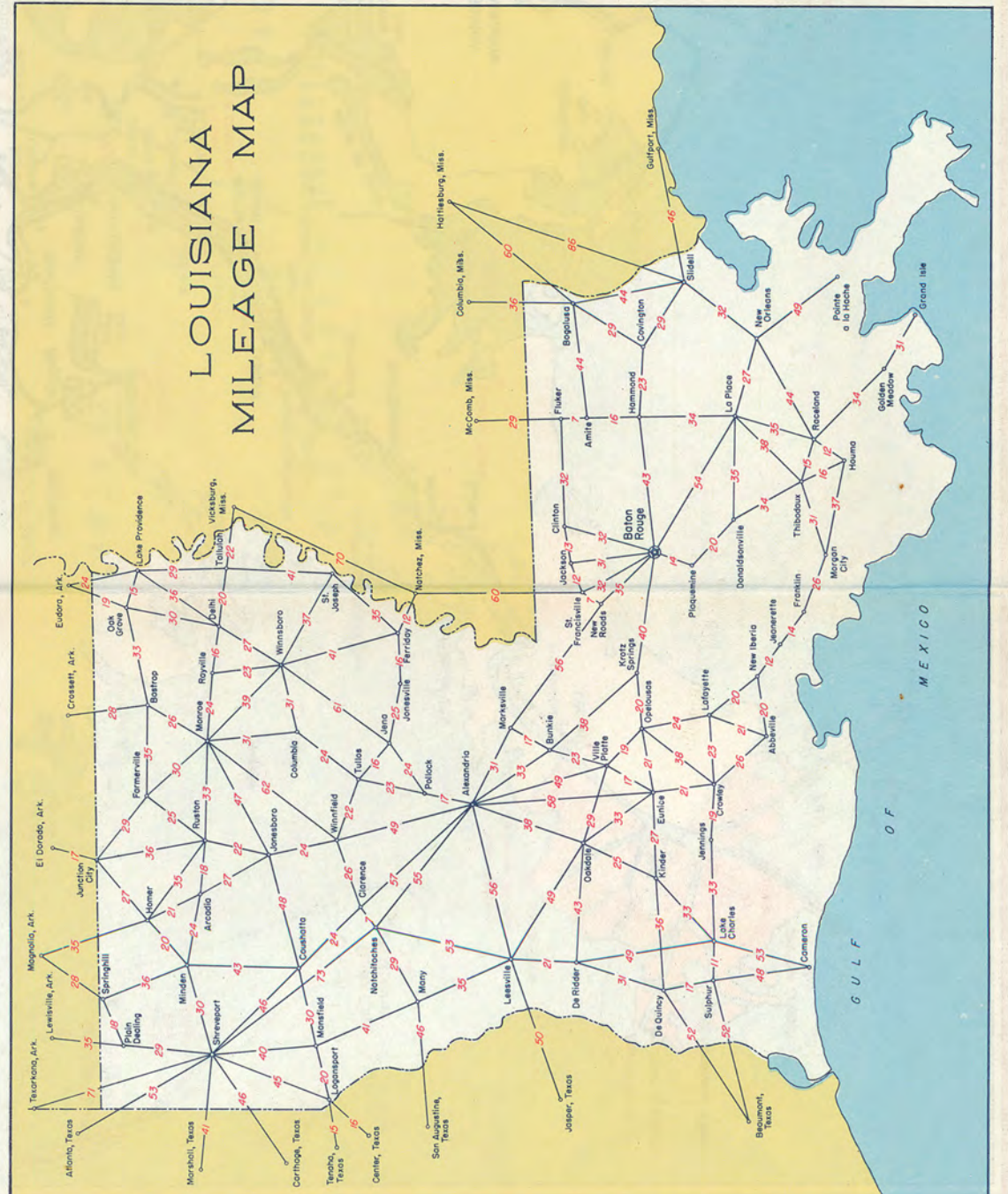

Throughout midwinter and early spring, Louisiana is a study in brilliant hues. It is Azalea time, and the floral trails are alive with color.

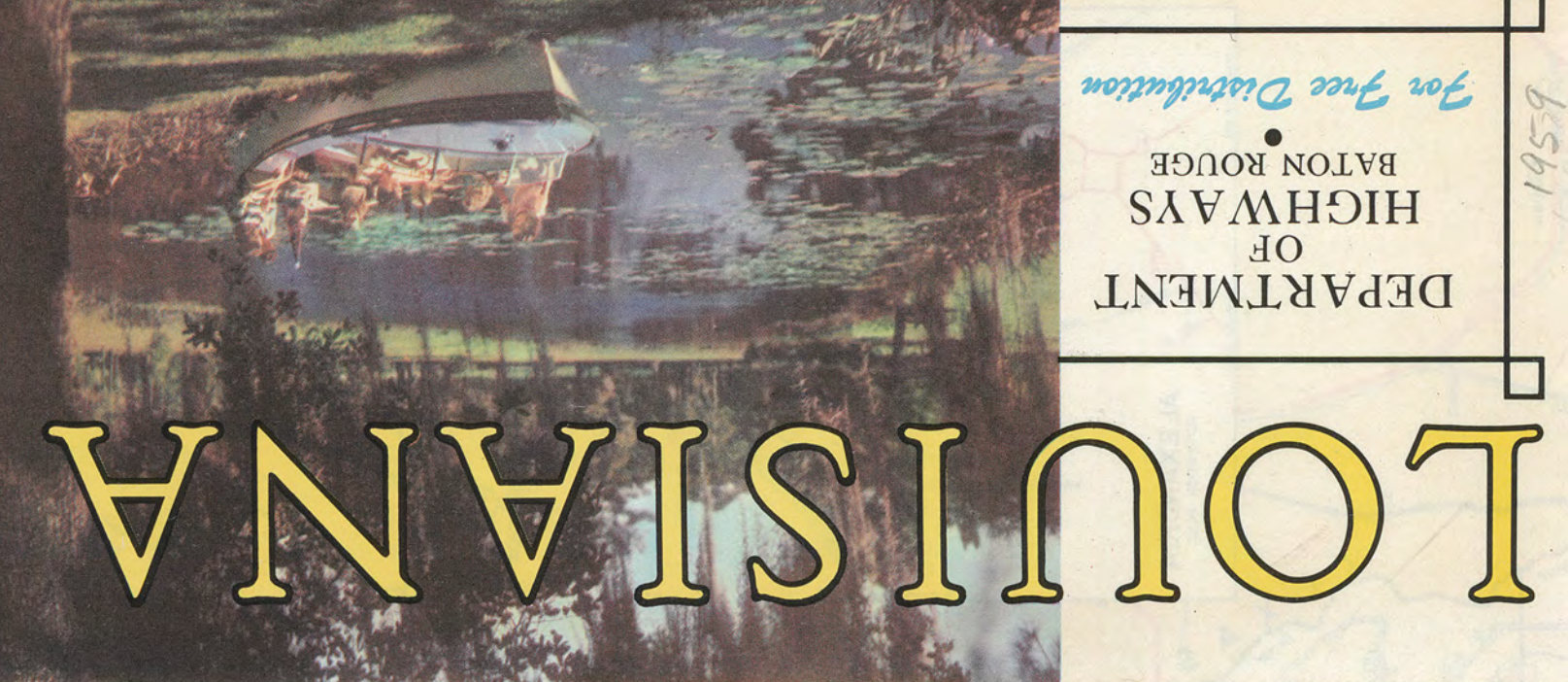

PLEASE OBSERVE

THESE HIGHWAY LAWS

- Do not exceed the following statutory speed limits:
 - Rural Automobiles 40 miles per hour
 - Buses 55 miles per hour
 - Trucks 45 miles per hour
- Built up areas
 - All Vehicles 25 miles per hour

Do not drive at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions existing at the time.

Do not drive while under the influence of intoxicants or narcotics.

Do not pass school bus while taking on or discharging passengers.

Do not drive unless you have a driver's license (except residents of states not requiring a license).

THESE SAFETY SUGGESTIONS

Keep to the right of the center line, except while passing.

Don't overdrive the reach of your headlights at night.

Let the other fellow know when you are going to stop—SIGNAL.

Dim your headlights when meeting another vehicle.

REPORT OF ACCIDENTS

The law requires that the driver of any motor vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the death or injury of any person, or in property damage exceeding \$1000.00, or in the loss of a vehicle, within 24 hours, make a report of such accident to the State Police, or if the accident happens in a city, to the police department of that city.
