Underage Drinking Statistics*

- In 2014, about 8.7 million people ages 12-20 (22.7% of this age group) reported drinking alcohol in the past month. Nearly 5.4 million (14.2%) were binge drinkers (15.8% of males and 12.4% females), and 1.4 million (3.7%) were heavy drinkers (4.6% males and 2.7% females).
- Young adults ages 18-22 enrolled full-time in college were more likely than their peers not enrolled full time to use alcohol in the past month, to binge drink, and to drink heavily.

Underage Drinking Statistics

- Adults age 21 or older who first used alcohol before age 21 were more likely than adults who had their first drink at age 21 or older to be classified with alcohol dependence or abuse (9.6% vs. 2.1%).
- In 2013 Thirty-three percent (33%) of 15- to 20-year-old drivers who were killed in motor vehicle crashes (BAC .01 or higher) had been drinking. 28% had a BAC of .08 or higher (legal limit of 21 and above).



J.U.D.E. History

- 1993 J.U.D.E. was established to curb the sale and possession of alcohol by minors in response to growing concerns and problems associated with underage drinking.
- 1996 J.U.D.E. was named the National Law Enforcement Association Innovative Program of the Year
- 1998-2008 J.U.D.E. was recognized by LSU Campus Community Coalition for Change, for fostering a healthier and safer community by reducing collegiate high risk drinking.
- 2004 J.U.D.E. tops 1,000 arrest for the year. (1068)





The Law and Underage Drinking

- 14:93.11 – Unlawful sale or serving to persons under twenty-one
- 14:93.12 – Purchase and public possession of alcoholic beverages by persons under twenty-one
- 14:93.13 – Unlawful purchase of alcoholic beverages by person on behalf of person under twenty-one
- 14:333 – Misrepresentation of age to obtain alcoholic beverages or gain entry to a licensed premises

The Law and Underage Drinking

- 13:91.2 – Unlawful sale or serving to persons under 21
- 13:91.3 – Purchase and public possession of alcoholic beverages by persons under 21
- 13:91.4 – Unlawful purchase of alcoholic beverages by persons on behalf of persons under 21
- 13:91.9 – Misrepresentation of age to obtain alcoholic beverages or gain entry to licenses premises

The Law and Underage Drinking

- It is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 to possess or consume alcohol
- There are 5 exceptions
 - Established religious purposes
 - With a parent, spouse, or legal guardian who is 21 or older and must be at least 18 years of age
 - Medical purposes
 - Private residence
 - Pursuant to lawful ownership of a retail business

The Law and Underage Drinking

- Violators age 17 and over are issued a misdemeanor summons or arrested.
- Violators who are age 16 and under:
 - Age must be confirmed
 - Parent or Legal Guardian is contacted
 - Juvenile Disposition Form is filled out
 - Evidence is taken
 - Paperwork is forwarded to prosecuting agency/Juvenile court.

Program Design

- How to combat underage drinking?
 - Focus on Big Picture – Sale, Possession, and Consumption
- Compliance – Teams check to ensure licensed businesses do not sell to underage.
- J.U.D.E. – Teams focus on areas where underage drinking occurs.
- Special Events – Teams focus on areas where underage drinking occurs.

Compliance Checks

- Send confidential informant into a business to purchase alcohol
- CI enters business without identification
- If minor successfully purchases alcohol, then team issues summons to clerk and business
- All businesses are checked regularly
- Teams also respond to complaints
- East Baton Rouge has approximately 980 licensed businesses



J.U.D.E. Task Force

- Perform patrols with J.U.D.E. teams
- Focus on areas with high volumes of underage people and large quantities of alcohol
- Respond to complaints
- Issue summons for possession and purchase on behalf

J.U.D.E. Task Force

- Focus on high volume/underage areas.
 - Campus Bars
 - Liquor/Convenience Stores
 - Special Events (Parades, Balloon Festivals, Graduation, Proms, Ball Games)
 - House Parties
 - Student Apartments/Housing
 - License Leasing



J.U.D.E. Task Force

■ Agency Coordinator

- Supervises and Leads Team.
- Main Point of Contact.
- Processes Intelligence and Local Knowledge
- Utilizes Intelligence to Develop Task Force Plan

J.U.D.E. Task Force

- Each team has a designated evidence officer
- Samples may be taken from confiscated alcoholic beverages
- All evidence should be photographed
 - IDs/Licenses, Vehicles, Plates, Alcohol, etc.

J.U.D.E. Task Force

■ Alcohol Sample Identification

- File Number
- Name
- Date
- Time
- Label As J.U.D.E. on Evidence Envelope















J.U.D.E. Task Force

- Once samples have been taken, remaining alcohol should be destroyed.
- Beer, hard liquor, and other alcoholic beverages are poured out. Containers are disposed of.
- Kegs should be emptied.





J.U.D.E. Task Force

- Exceptions to destroying alcohol.
 - House parties
 - Illegal bars/Unlicensed bar and businesses
 - Goodhouses/Safehouses.
 - Anytime alcohol may be entered as evidence into court and potentially returned to defendants

J.U.D.E. Task Force

■ Each Team Should have

- A Copy of All Applicable City, State and/or Local Ordinances.
- List of Alcoholic Beverage Outlets Located within the Parish.
- Paperwork
- Team List and Contact List
- Electronic Equipment (Radio, Camera, Alcohol Detector)
- Evidence Equipment


■ Some underage characteristics.

- Anyone who looks under 30 years of age?
- Sorority Cups: Large handled cups that are painted with paint pens
- Bumper stickers that pertain to collegiate activities (Fraternities, College Names, Ducks Unlimited, etc.)

Special Events

■ Special Events

- Teams patrol special events to stop underage drinking, illegal consumption, and open container violations.
- Ball games tend to have high quantities of alcohol and a high volume of underage drinkers.
- Parades also have a lot of alcohol and a lot of underage drinkers.

Special Events

- Consideration needs to be given to agent transportation.
 - Cars
 - Foot
 - Boats
 - Golf Carts
 - Four-Wheelers

Special Events

- Uniform
- Undercover/Plainclothes
 - Notify appropriate agencies if working J.U.D.E. Task Force or special events in plain clothes.













Other Notable Guidelines

- DWI's should be handled by the agency with appropriate jurisdiction
- Female suspects should be searched/handled by female officers
- All agencies should have a common operating channel

Other Notable Guidelines

- Controlled Dangerous Substances (CDS)
 - Once Narcotics have been found cases should be handled by city police officers, sheriff's deputies or other agents assigned to task force.
 - Call narcotics officers as needed.

- Split Lamination
- Unfocused Photo/Dark Photo
- Several Type (Font) Styles
- Eraser Marks
- Bumps or Bubble Under Lamination
- Irregular Identification Format and Style

- Types of Fake ID
 - Manufactured – Homemade or bought from novelty store.
 - Duplicates – Minor buys or borrows a duplicate ID from someone who is older and shares a physical resemblance.
 - Duplicates are the biggest problem regarding fake IDs.
 - Stolen or Borrowed
 - Altered

Baton Rouge City Court

- Court Procedures for Alcohol Violations
 - Options
 - Pretrial-Entered into by first time offenders to keep incident off of record. (Expunge)
 - Go to Trial
 - Plea-bargain with prosecutor
 - Plead guilty

Baton Rouge City Court

- Substance Abuse Self-Awareness Program (SASAP)
 - To educate and increase offender awareness of the dangers and consequences of the use of alcohol.
 - This program consist of six hours of education training on substance abuse.

Baton Rouge City Court

- Court's Effective Decision Making School (CEDMS)
 - Encourage participants to develop critical thinking skills that will lead to pro-social behavior and reduce the frequency of anti-social behavior.
 - CEDMS is a six hour education program that offers the opportunity to develop critical thinking skills and reduce impulsive activity and develop skills that will result in responsible thinking.
