

Dear Ms. Horne,

Please accept this most recent amendment to the Transit Element of the Rapides Area Planning Commissions Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP) for the Alexandria UZA for inclusion in the State's Transportation Improvement Plan.

This amendment reflects the fiscal year regional distributions of the FTA 5307 (Urbanized Formula), 5337 (State of Good Repair), and 5339 (Bus and Facilities) funding. These programs of projects in the attached spreadsheets replace previous versions of the FY 2023 - 2026 Transit TIP for the UZA in the entirety.

Investments in Asset Management are in line with achieving performance targets identified in 2023. The 2021 ATRANS Service Planning and Asset Study rated 45% of ATRANS bus shelters in 'good' and 35% in 'poor' condition. Amendment No. 4 increases total TIP transit investment (FTA 5307 + FTA, 5339) 56%. It maintains TIP FTA 5307 investment in transit facilities and security projects but reduces investment in preventative maintenance, shop equipment, and rolling stock. Transit operating assistance increases 23% with addition of unspent FTA 5307 operating funds from prior federal fiscal year.

The Transportation Policy Committee and Commission approved these amendments on June 5, 2024. Timely processing by your office of this updated will be, as always, greatly appreciated. If you have any questions or need additional information, please advise.

#### Background

Alexandria-Pineville Metropolitan Planning Organization (APMPO) is responsible for multi-modal transportation planning and investment decision-making inside the Alexandria-Pineville metro area and anticipates, forecasts and plans for the transportation needs of today, tomorrow and the future. It does not to fund, design, build, or operate transportation systems.

The APMPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is an on-going program that assigns funding to specific highway, road, bridge, transit, bicycle, pedestrian, and other regionally significant transportation projects. Inclusion in the TIP is federally required before any federal funds can be made available for use on a project. The current TIP covers projects that are expected to be active during the Federal Fiscal Years (FFY) 2023 through 2026. The complete project list and additional project information can be found in the current TIP document located on the APMPO's website at, <a href="https://www.rapc.info/transportation">www.rapc.info/transportation</a>.

The four-year transit portion of the FY 2023 - 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) helps support the continued operation along existing transit routes and the overall efficiency of the Alexandria Transit (ATRANS) system. However, the cost benefit ratio of expanding fixed routes within the metropolitan area remains prohibitive. The TIP also makes provisions for preventive maintenance, vehicle and facility replacement, as well as equipment purchases.

#### Overall

As proposed, Amendment No. 4 increases total TIP transit investment (FTA 5307 + FTA. 5339) 56%. It maintains TIP FTA 5307 investment in transit facilities and security projects but reduces investment in preventative maintenance, shop equipment, and rolling stock. Transit operating assistance increases 23% with addition of unspent FTA 5307 operating funds from prior federal fiscal year. The reduction in FTA 5307 rolling stock investment results from the replacement of three separate projects each replacing one 30-35' bus using FTA 5307 funds with one project to replace three 30-35' buses using FTA 5339 funds.
